This year brought with it countless challenges and moments of great uncertainty for families near and far. However, one thing that never faltered was the commitment of Second Harvest to serve this community. It has been my greatest honor to serve alongside each member of the Second Harvest staff, its Board of Directors, Partner Agencies, and the countless volunteers who worked shoulder-to-shoulder with us inside the warehouse and at community distributions.

During the past year, food insecurity rates rose to levels not seen since the Great Depression. In response, our staff, donors and volunteers proudly stepped up, rising to the challenge as we navigated the pandemic—initially day-by-day problem solving, and then long-term planning. Nearly all our internal and external processes had to be re-envisioned to ensure safety to staff, volunteers, and those we serve. This was no easy task, and it took the whole community to achieve the successes we have celebrated along the way. We are in awe of your dedication to our mission, evidenced by your ongoing support.

Without you, we would not have been able to quadruple our mobile food distribution events to provide critical food assistance to our most vulnerable neighbors. And we would not have been able to distribute a record 13.8 million pounds of food throughout the Big Bend, providing more than 11.5 million meals to fight hunger!

Despite these historic challenges, we've also had many exciting milestones during the past year, including my appointment as CEO, a rebranding campaign to help center our work on our mission and reach new audiences, and infrastructure improvements to increase efficiencies.

We are growing, we are grateful, and we are mission-focused. We've emerged from the past year stronger than ever. Through it all, one thing remains the same—with your support, we will continue fighting hunger throughout the Big Bend. Together, we can accomplish great things. Thank you for always being there for us..

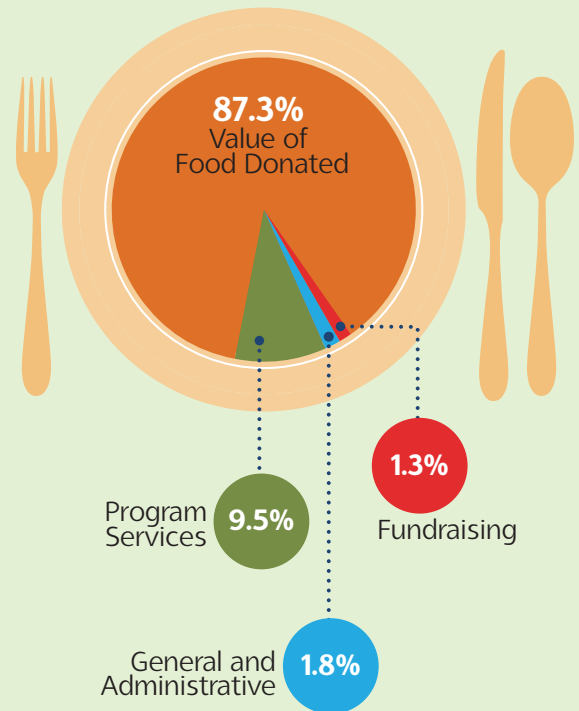
